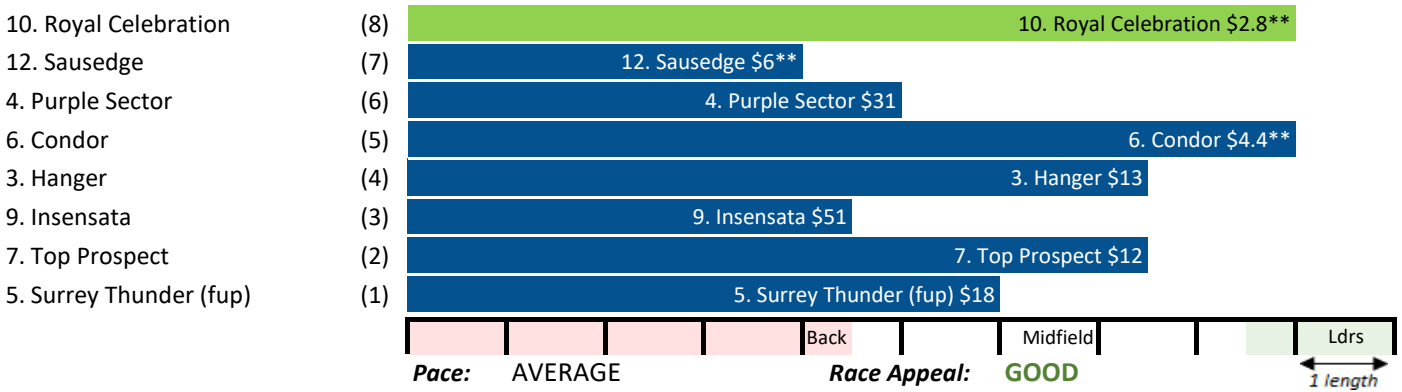


## ROSEHILL MAPS & RATED MARKETS - 28 March 2020

<b>Track Pattern:</b> On pace / handy ADV	█ = Negative map zone - historically poor value. Risky to back.

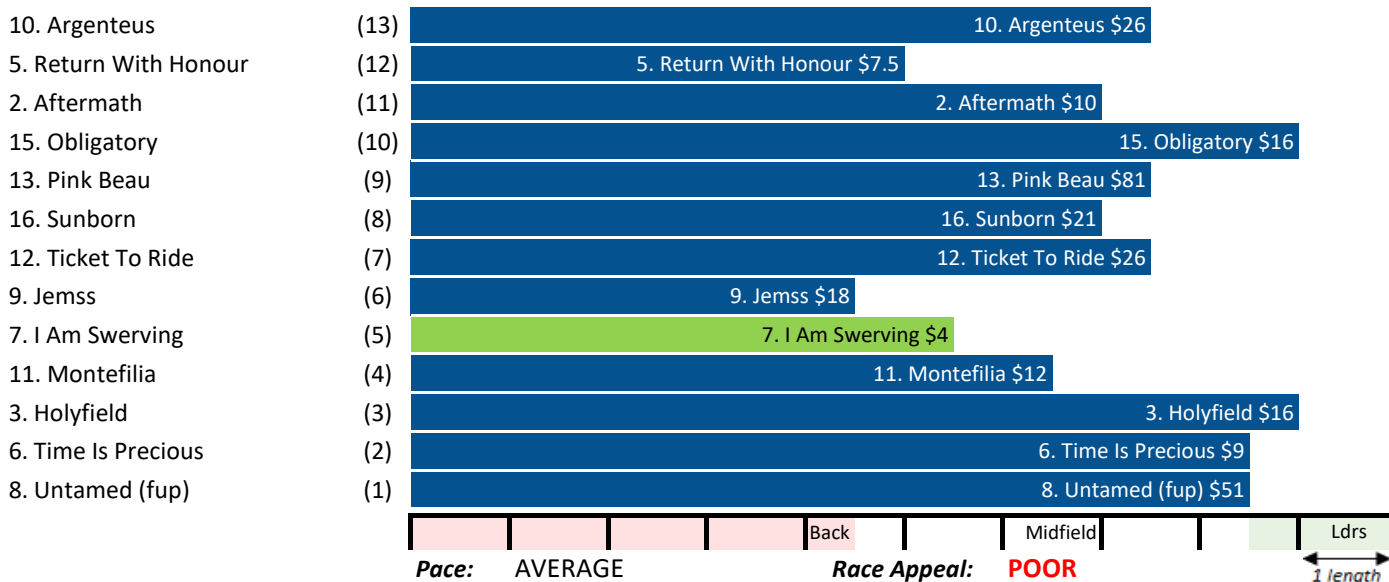

BEST PROFILE	RATING REQUIRED TO WIN THIS RACE: 94+
10. Royal Celebration  6. Condor	<p>Royal Celebration brings quality and consistency to this race with recent ratings of 94.6, 94.8 and 93.3. While he doesn't look the horse he was earlier in his career, the fact he does have past ratings in the 100-102 range also leaves some possibility that on any given day he could improve on those recent figures. The maps suggests he can work forward to find a nice position up near the lead. A wide drawn pace runner with multiple recent ratings up to the likely standard presents a strong profile. Condor brings a similar profile with 95.3, 93.3 and 93.8 in his last three runs and he'll almost certainly get up on the lead without doing much work. Sausedge comes off a 94.2 and 93.2 which is super competitive, but her get back style on a track that might favour those closer and the fact the two dangers will be up on the lead has to be against from a betting perspective.</p>

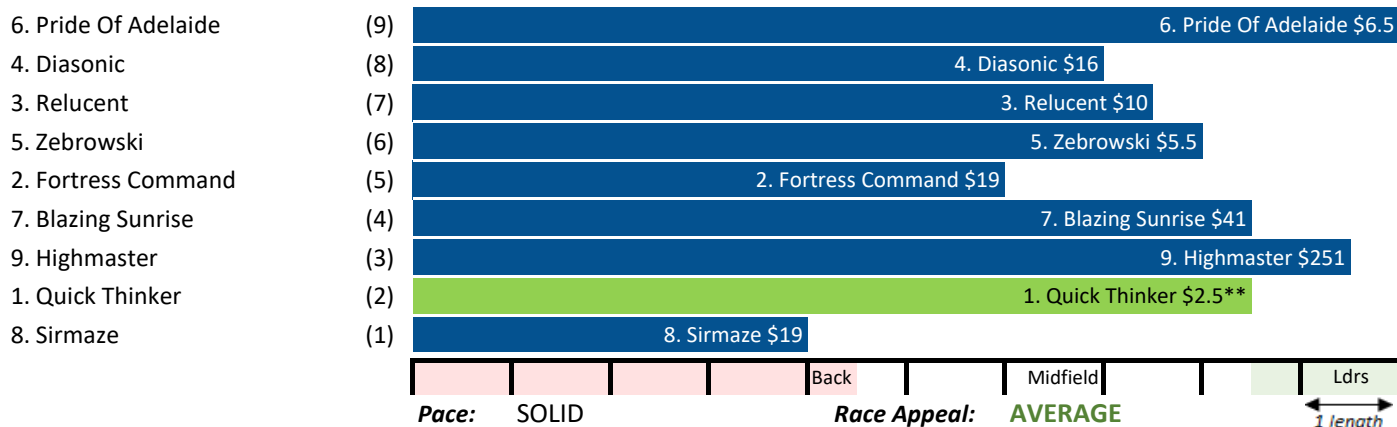


BEST PROFILE	RATING REQUIRED TO WIN THIS RACE: 85+
7. I Am Swerving	Numbers 15 through 19 are emergencies so this map and market will change. Either way it looks like a lottery with a winning standard almost certain to be above the best exposed form, due to virtually all of these having the scope to improve to new peaks. Who can improve the most? I Am Swerving brings the best lead up ratings (84.4) from a 3rd placing behind Prague when not in the best ground closest to the inside. He's precariously positioned on the map though, at risk of getting too far back if Parr can't get him to keep a few of those on his outside from crossing.

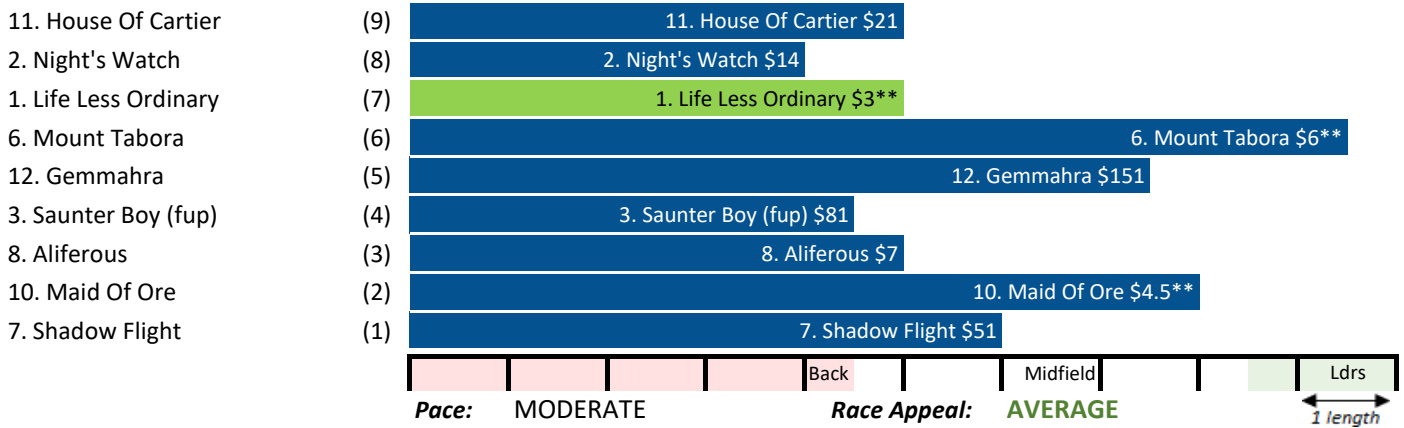

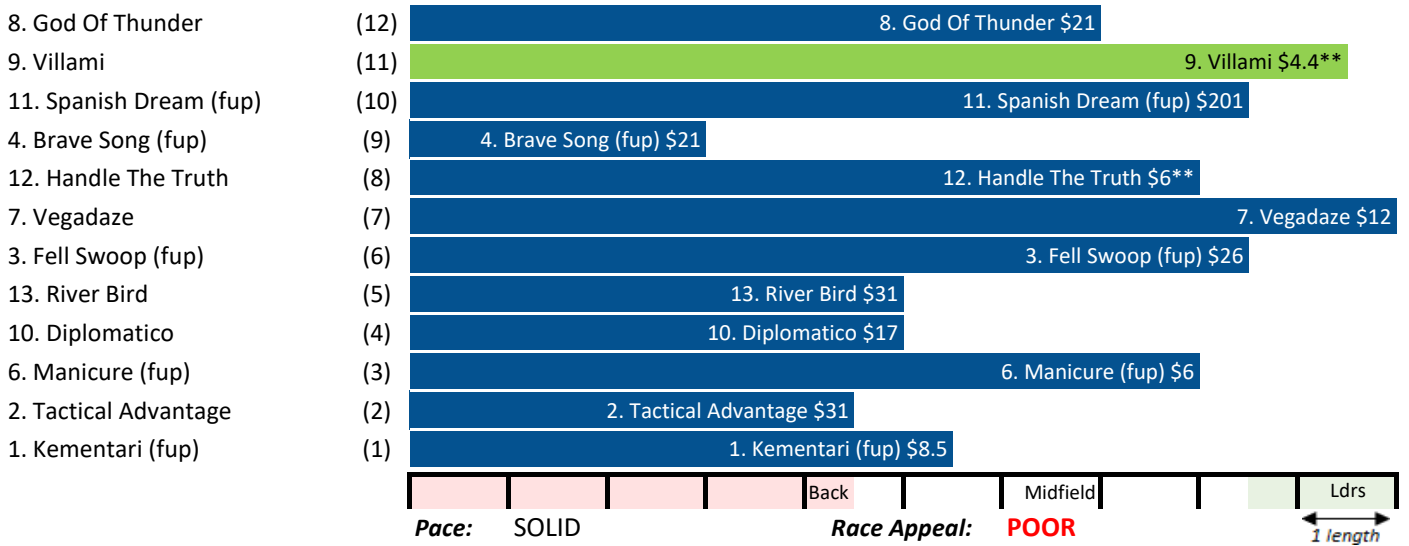
BEST PROFILE	RATING REQUIRED TO WIN THIS RACE: 93+
1. Quick Thinker 5. Zebrowski 6. Pride Of Adelaide	Quick Thinker ran 96 LS @ 1500m behind Funstar, which is the best 3YO form going around at the moment. He has excellent prospects to hold or improve slightly on that up to 2000m here, especially on a soft track and from a good draw. Clearly the one to beat. Zebrowski is an emerging middle distance talent, bringing a 91 rating with the prospect that he can be clearly better at 2000m. Pride of Adelaide is a free running type, up a long way in grade, but does bring a 90.6 rating which is competitive among those away from Quick Thinker. Not sure if he's yet ready for 2000m at this level?

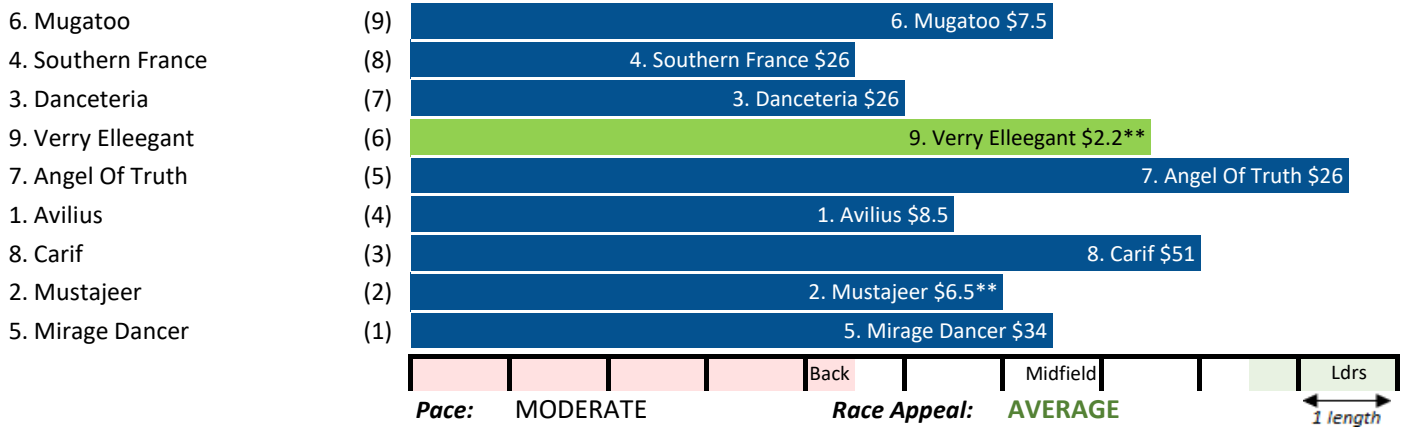
BEST PROFILE	RATING REQUIRED TO WIN THIS RACE: 97.5+
6. Mount Tabora 10. Maid Of Ore 1. Life Less Ordinary	<p>Mount Taborra has been solid around the 97.5 in his last two and could get along at a softer speed than he did LS in his first go at 2000m. He only needs to hold form to be somewhere in the finish and any improvement could see him win. Gets wonder jock Tom Marquand on board here - good longshot. Maid Of Ore bings 97 and 97.8 from her last two and was good LS at Canberra after working early. She gets a softer run here. Life Less Ordinary brings compelling ratings with 100.6 and 101.5 from his last two that say he's enormously hard to beat, so I can see why he is a dominant favourite. However, he's drawn inside in both and been able to settle closer than normal and track up to the 600m to be in touch. When he draws wide, he typically settles 6-10L from the lead (avg 8.3L) and has ratings are more in the 97-100 range. The scratchings have greatly helped here and they could see him settle more like 5L back, which is the right zone for him to win, but it's still hard to get him anywhere near \$2.20 in the market.</p>

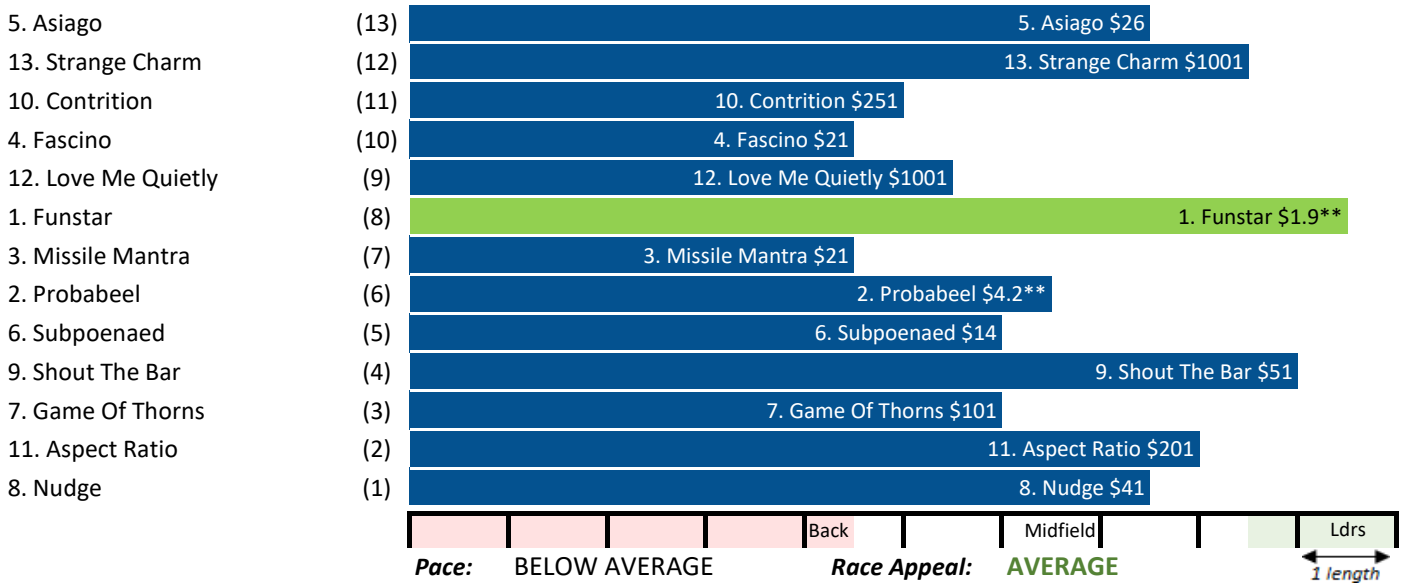
BEST PROFILE	RATING REQUIRED TO WIN THIS RACE: 99+
9. Villami 12. Handle The Truth	There's plenty of uncertainty here with some key first up runners and a very congested map up front, which will likely set up a strong pace. Villami was outstanding FUP to win with a 101.4 rating, which would likely win this. The uncertainty is that it looks like she'll need to work harder this time to find the front or settle outside a leader. Handle The Truth comes off a Canberra win with a massive weight and big drop here. He ran 100 there and has 4 other ratings around that mark. He's capable of winning. Manicure is first up so market leads will be important - but she has run 100 at each of her last two first up attempts and maps well.

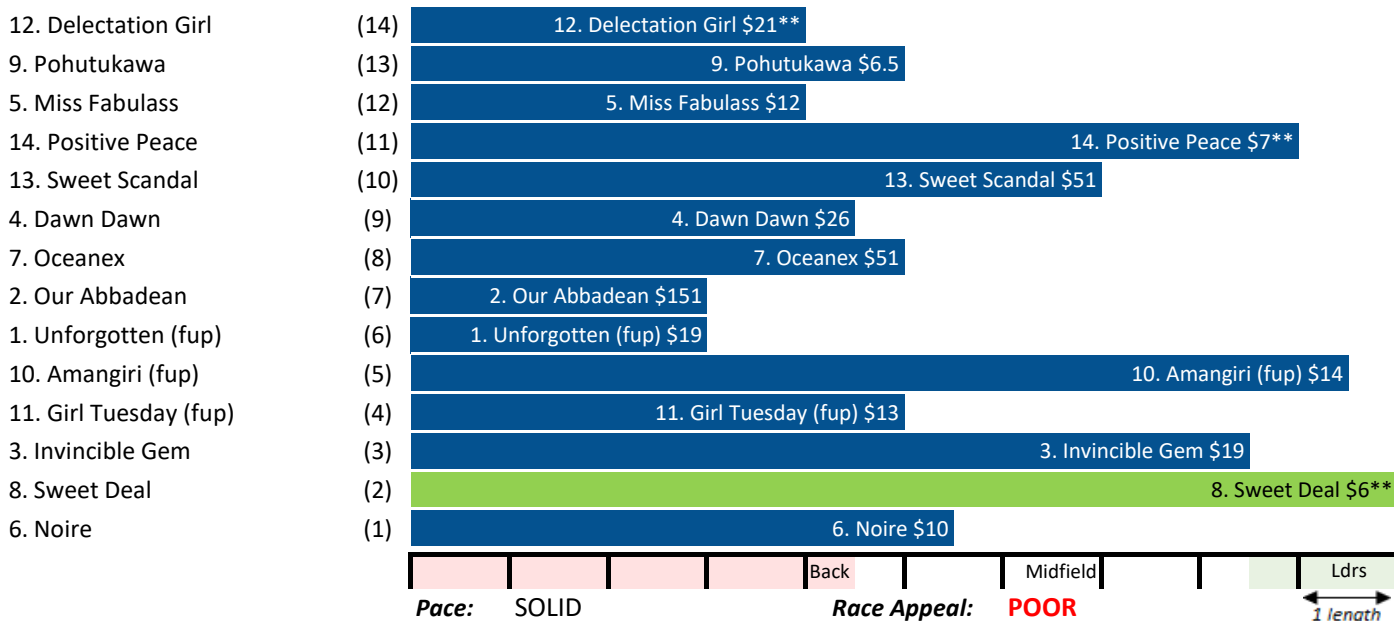
BEST PROFILE	RATING REQUIRED TO WIN THIS RACE: 101+
<p>9. Verry Elleegant</p> <p>2. Mustajeer</p> <p>6. Mugatoo</p>	<p>Verry Elleegant is back to her career best form this preparation. She ran 103.4 two runs ago at 2000m and then 104.5 last Saturday at 2000m when beaten by a high quality performance from the UK import Addeybb. Her sectional speed in that race was very impressive, which is an asset in what looks to be a moderately run race here. Clearly the one to beat.</p> <p>Mustajeer spiked a 104.5 FUP first up in a hot run 1900m and then regressed LS but was still solid when 99 behind Master Of Wine. The big key for him is the step up to 2400m here, which he's looking for. It's easy to forecast him 100+ here, which puts him in the mix. Mugatoo is the only one in this race with a 2400m lead up run and does have a sharp sprint which is likely to be an asset. Avilius ran a career peak winning this race last year on a bog, but has become unreliable, even taking into account some excuses. He has the talent, but you'd be brave to back him off recent form.</p>

1. Funstar 2. Probabeel	Funstar has built an incredibly consistent and high quality rating profile in just 7 starts so far and as commented previously, she profiled as a horse coming into this Autumn that could become an elite superstar. Her 99.8 win by 1.3L over Probabeel LS is clearly the best form in this race, she'll race forward again and still very much looks on the up this preparation with the potential for new peaks. We could see that in this race at 2000m. Probabeel was excellent LS making up ground from too far back behind Funstar LS and is the logical threat again. I'm not sure she can improve up to 2000m, perhaps just hold her rating, in which case she's more relying on Funstar under-performing a little. I'm keen to see what Subpoenaed can do here. She's hard to like against the top two, but ever since last Spring she profiled like a Filly that could reach her potential over 2000m in the Autumn. She gets her chance here.

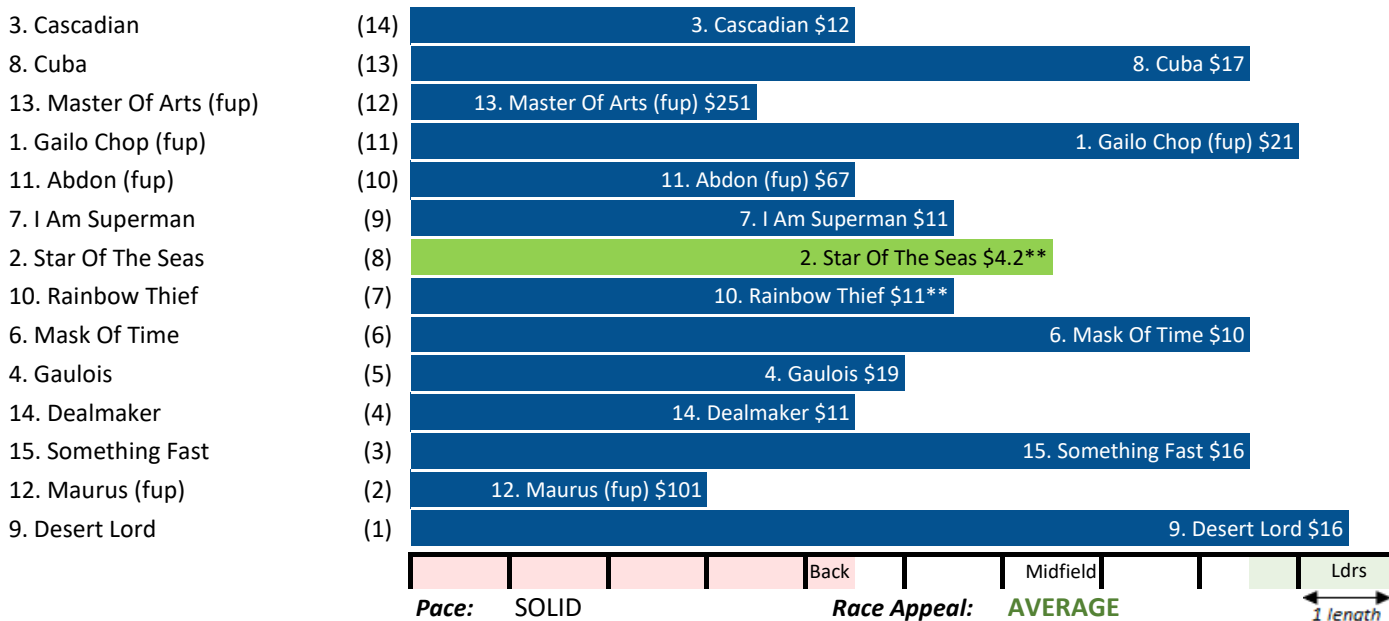

14. Positive Peace 8. Sweet Deal	An incredibly competitive race with a stack of them capable of running around the 100 mark on their best form - made more complicated by a few of those horses failing in the main lead up LS, the G1 Coolmore that was on very heavy ground and a track where the inside was a clear disadvantage. Positive Peace brings the best value profile after running 101.9 last start to win and 99, 99.4 at her prior two. She should work forward to settle just off the lead - giving her genuine claims IF she can hold her form. After four 99+ performances in a row though it's hard to be confident. Sweet Deal profiles well as the likely leader with a 99.3 LS and 101.2 FUP at 1200m (although it's a query using that for a 1500m race). Taking gloss of that profile though is that she'll probably have to roll along at a strong speed and has had 28 days off. It's hard to forecast her much higher than 99 here at 1500m. So while her profile reads well, I'm conflicted by the competing factors and plenty of others than can run to that level on their best. \$3.60 in the market right now is way too short, but that can of course change on the day. Pohutukawa is one of the others that certainly has the talent to win. She ran 99 two start ago and has run in the 100-102 range a number of times. She did however fail in the G1 Coolmore (as fav) and will get a long way back here, which is a risk.

2. Star Of The Seas 10. Rainbow Thief	Star Of The Seas was heavily backed FUP and resumed on his preferred wet ground with a new career peak 98.8... over 1100m which is short of his best! Up to 1500m here with N Rawiller riding on wet ground and a nice looking map, he looks to have strong prospects to at least hold something close to that rating. If he does that, he'll be very hard to beat. Rainbow Thief brings a nice longshots profile as a lightly raced 4YO with a recent rating up to a level that could win this. That came two starts ago over 1500m at Sandown on Soft 5 ground when he won impressively by 3.5 lengths with a 99.3. He regressed a little to 95.8 LS up to 1600m at Caulfield, but it was hardly a poor run. Anywhere in the range of those last two is competitive in this race and something at the upper end could see him win..
